



Increase parent/caregiver communication efficacy with youth. Effective adult-youth communication reduces risky behaviors in youth such as sexual initiation, substance use, and reduction of STIs. Community driven-focus groups of adults and youth to inform the toolkit development. A toolkit with training modules and local resources.

Training modules cover: Being an "askable adult", the adolescent brain development, strength based approaches to sexual health, & resources


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Types of Community Engagement

Key Takeaways for Building Effective Partnerships

1. Needs of partners were identified first, and then funding source was identified (not vice versa as is common)	2. Plan to have long term relationship with community partners that are nimble and move back and forth on the continuum	3. "If you're doing the work, you need to be in community"So when you see the opportunity, you're ready
4. This work does not happen behind a computer - take the work to the community and build relationships	5. There is a need for intentionality in all components of this work - avoid unilateral decision making	6. Relationship building takes time


