

Crash Not Accident




When we call something an "accident," it implies that no one is at fault and that no one, including the driver, bears responsibility for the outcome.

The term "crash," on the other hand, is more specific in terms of the action's outcome without the unpreventable implication.

It is vitally important that we use the right words to describe the situation, especially when distracted driving, impaired driving, and other avoidable actions are at the center of an incident.

2023 Michigan Crash Clock



Every 1 minute and 50 seconds, a traffic crash was reported in Michigan.

Because of a traffic crash:

- Every 7 minutes and 24 seconds, one person was injured.
- Every 8 hours, one person was killed.








2023 Michigan Traffic Crash Data



Speeding/Aggressive Driving

Excessive speed by any motorist, or non-motorist, that was a factor in the crash.

Who Determines MI Speed Limits?



State law dictates that MDOT and the MSP jointly set speed limits based on the 85th percentile speed, which is the speed at or below which 85 percent of drivers are currently driving a given section of road.

For example, if 85 percent of drivers on a section of road are driving 55 mph or less, the 85th percentile speed would be 55.

2023 Speeding/Aggressive Driving

Of the 484,281 motor vehicle drivers involved in crashes, 21,535 had a hazardous action of "Speed too Fast."

Single motor vehicle crashes were the most common type associated with speed-involved crashes.

2023 Speeding/Aggressive Driving




Excessive speed was a factor in:

- 210 fatalities in crashes
- 805 suspected serious injuries

"Speed too Slow" was also reported as a hazardous action for 146 crashes.

Speed and Braking Distance

Are you giving yourself enough time to stop?

Perception Distance

How far your vehicle travels - in ideal conditions - from the time your see a hazard until your brain recognizes it.

Reaction Distance

How far you will travel after seeing the hazard until you physically hit the brakes.

Braking Distance

How far your vehicle will travel - in ideal conditions while you are braking

Occupant Protection

Seat belt use by motorists is measured two ways:

- what motorists report to police at the scene of a traffic crash (reported usage)
- observation surveys, where motorists are unaware of the presence of researchers (observed usage)

Michigan Seat Belt Law

Michigan has a primary seat belt law, which means law enforcement can stop and ticket motorists solely for not being buckled up.

The law requires:

Passengers 8-15 years of age to buckle up in all seating positions.

Drivers and front-seat passengers are to be buckled up.

Michigan Seat Belt Law

Michigan's child passenger safety law requires:

Children **younger than age 4 to ride in a car seat in the rear seat if the vehicle has a rear seat**. If all available rear seats are occupied by children under 4, then a child under 4 may ride in a car seat in the front seat. A child in a rear-facing car seat may only ride in the front seat if the airbag is turned off.

Children are to be properly buckled in a **car seat or booster seat until they are 8 years old or 4 feet 9 inches tall**. Children must ride in a seat until they reach the age requirement or the height requirement, whichever comes first.

2023 Failure to Use Restraint(s)

Of the 478,648 reported drivers and passengers involved in crashes when seat belt use was known:

- 471,106 reported they were using seat belts at the time of the crash
- 7,542 reported they were not using seat belts at the time of the crash

2023 Failure to Use Restraint(s)

A total of 285 people in motor vehicle crashes were ejected while not wearing a seat belt.

- 179 were drivers
- 102 were injured passengers
- 4 were uninjured passengers
- 66 unbelted people were killed

2023 Failure to Use Restraint(s)

Restraint usage among drivers and injured passengers aged 0-14, as reported by police at the scene of a traffic crash was 90.6%.

The age group with the lowest restraint usage was children aged 11-14 (88.6%).


2023 Alcohol-Impaired Crashes

Any driver, pedestrian, or cyclist involved in the crash reported as "had-beendrinking (HBD)" by the police officer.

2023 Alcohol-Impaired Crashes

There were 1,589 drinking drivers in crashes who were aged 24 or younger.

One-year comparison between 2023 and 2022 in traffic fatalities where HBD occurred.

Orange – increase Cream – same or decrease

2023 Drug-Impaired Crashes

A crash is drug-involved if any driver, pedestrian, or cyclist involved was reported as suspected of drug use by the police officer on the Traffic Crash Report.



2023 Alcohol-Drug Impaired Crashes

Of the 1,021 fatal crashes that occurred, 230 were drug-involved, with at least one drugged bicyclist or pedestrian.

2023 Alcohol-Drug Impaired Crashes



- Alcohol was involved in 98 of the 230 fatal drug-involved crashes
- Of the 183 pedestrian deaths:
 - 45 were drug-involved
 - 15 were suspected of drug use
- Of the 33 drug-involved motorcyclist crash deaths, 21 of those operators were coded as suspected drugs



2023 Distracted-Driving Crashes



Driver distraction includes any activity that shifts attention from the driving task:

- Talking , texting, recording on cell phone
- Talking to passengers
- Eating and drinking
- Adjusting the radio or GPS
- Adjusting hair, make-up

2023 Distracted Driving Crashes




A total of **15,136** crashes occurred that involved a distracted driver.

56 of those crashes involved a fatality, resulting in59 fatalities.

2,940 of those crashes involved a lane departure.

5,490 of the crashes took place at an intersection.

2023 Cell Phones & Crashes



A total of 2,269 crashes occurred where a motor vehicle driver was using a cell phone.

 11 pedestrians and 7 bicyclists were reported to be using cell phones at the time of the crash Michigan's Vulnerable Roadway Users and Traffic Safety

2023 Pedestrian Crashes

At least one pedestrian in a crash with a motor vehicle on a public roadway.

2023 Pedestrian Crashes

Pedestrians are defined as a person

- On foot
- On skis
- On skates
- On rollerblades
- On a non-motorized wheelchair
- As the rider of a horse or a horse and buggy

2023 Pedestrian Crashes

- For each pedestrian killed (183) there were about 10 pedestrians injured (1,743)
 - Not crossing at an intersection was the deadliest action committed by the pedestrian.
- 14 were under 20 years of age and 42 were over age 65.

2023 Bicyclist Crashes

There is no law that requires Michigan cyclists to wear helmets or prevents them from talking on cell phones while riding.

2023 Bicyclist Crashes

There were 1487 bicyclists involved in motor vehicle crashes in Michigan in 2023.

24 bicyclists were killed in 24 fatal crashes.

- 8 were the result of a had-been-drinking crash
- 4 of the 8 bicyclists had been drinking

2023 Bicyclist Crashes




Think about people who make up your county's vulnerable population of road users.



WHAT IS A TRAFFIC SAFETY NETWORK?

A Traffic Safety Network (TSN) is a group of persons concerned about the safety of motorists traveling on Michigan roadways.

TSNs are co-sponsored by the Michigan Office of Highway Safety Planning (OHSP) and AAA Michigan (AAA) to network, strengthen relationships, share best practices, provide educational programming, and promote traffic safety solutions.

Participation is open to anyone. Geographic location, the professional makeup of attendees, and the region's diverse needs shape the culture and focus of each network.

While every TSN is unique, all have a core membership comprised of professionals from public and private agencies representing traffic safety stakeholders.


