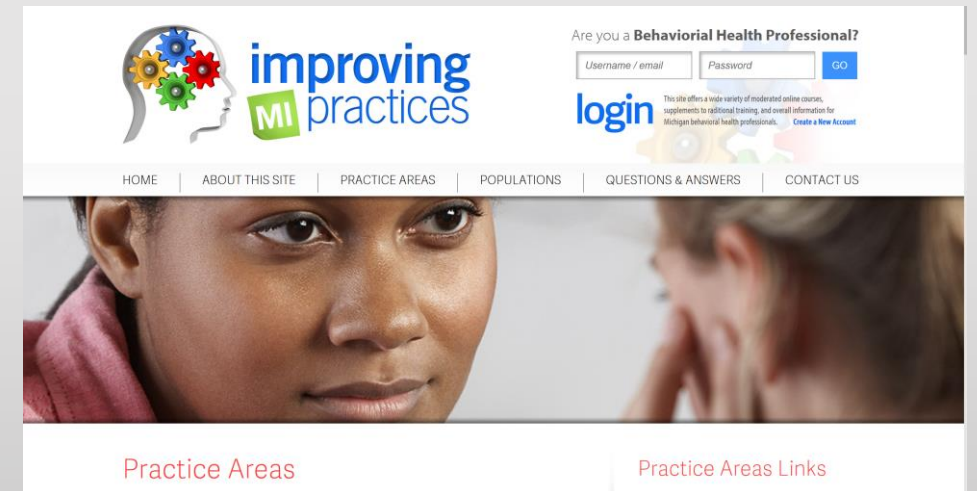

Certification Cycle 7

- Begins February 2018 and to be released December 2017
- Cycle 6 crosswalk available on MIHP website
- Certification Indicators: met (90-100%), met with conditions (80-89%), not met (<80%)

Maternal & Infant Risk Identifiers

- Literature review
- Collaboration with MDHHS and public partners
- Evidence-based screeners and tools including, but not limited to the following: Perceived Stress Scale, Everyday Perceived Discrimination Scale, Domestic Violence Tool, Fagerstrom Test for Nicotine Dependence, T-ACE questionnaire, and CAGE-D Risk Assessment.
- Four MIHP agencies in the final stages of piloting the Maternal Risk Identifier
- Infant Risk Identifier to be piloted next

Plans of Care- Part 1

- Effective February 1, 2018; posted on MIHP website
- Lists 12 activities that must be completed during the Risk Identifier visit
- Captures referrals at intake
- One signature required for the professional completing the Maternal/Infant Risk Identifier
- Education topics on separate document

Operations Guide and Forms

- 2018 Operations Guide posted on MIHP website, effective 02.01.2018
 - *Stay tuned for: web-friendly electronic, succinct version Summer of 2018*
- MDHHS Approval process occurring
- *Beneficiary Status Notification* form replaces the Prenatal & Infant Communication letters (i.e., Maternal A, B, C & Infant A, B, C) and is to be submitted to both the Medical Care Provider and Medicaid Health Plan at enrollment, risk level notification/change, discharge, and for any other updates

Information Technology (IT)

- Correction of Maternal & Infant Risk Identifiers within 30 days of completion is now allowable, as long as no associated discharge has been started
- New Maternal and Infant Risk Identifiers anticipated to be deployed in the *latter* part of 2018.
- ***Coming Soon in Summer of 2018***: MIHP website to have new look and ease of use

New Provider Inquiry/Application

- Inquiry meetings: 11.13.2017, 3.13.2018, 7.12.2018, 11.15.2018
- Application has been revised and is available on the MIHP website
- New orientation process: April 2018 and November 2018

Michigan Care Improvement Registry (MCIR)

- MIHP providers now have read-only access to the MCIR database
- The MIHP Personnel Roster includes a column to designate the staff members authorized by the agency to access MCIR through MILogin

Michigan Dental Registry (MiDR)

- All MIHP providers will have access to the MiDR application through the MDHHS MILogin system
- Youtube video explains how to get and use the MiDR application
- MiDR allows agencies to find a dentist in the area that accepts Medicaid and send a referral to that dentist
- Maintains security by issuing a referral identification number to each client
- Allows communication, coordination, and referrals between medical and dental providers
