Essential Duties

- Completes all responsibilities according to established protocols, policies, quality assurance, and best practices; and ensures regulatory compliance with HIPAA, OSHA, CLIA, Title X, 340b, and other relevant rules and regulations. Consults with Medical Director as required by collaborative practice agreement and established guidelines.
- Obtains complete health history including obstetric, gynecologic, contraceptive, medical, surgical, sexual, and family health; and psycho-social determinants of health.
- Performs physical examinations with special emphasis on reproductive system, including breast and cervical cancer screening, and diagnosis of sexually-transmitted infections.
- Completes comprehensive individual assessments incorporating all dimensions including health history, physical examination, substance abuse or domestic violence issues, family functioning, basic needs, and access to health care.
- Orders, performs, and interprets screening and diagnostic tests.
- Diagnoses various ailments based on sexual health assessments and test results.
- Develops and implements care plans in response to assessments, diagnoses, and client decision-making and health belief system. Evaluates and revises care plans as client status changes.
- Orders and/or administers medications and birth control per program and pharmaceutical policies.

Requirements and Qualifications:

- Knowledge of standards of care, diagnoses and treatments; appropriate preventative care and education, and coding for medical billing as acquired through the completion of a Master's degree in an advanced nursing practice or physician assistant program.
- Successful completion of required clinical training, and licensed to practice in Michigan as Nurse Practitioner, Nurse Midwife or Physician Assistant.
- Ability to perform Clinician role, adhering to scope of practice and within program medical policies and protocols, and seeking guidance from Medical Director as appropriate.
- Communication skills necessary to interact appropriately with clients, parents/guardians, coworkers, providers, partnering organizations, and the public through listening, speaking, and understanding.
