What is Human Trafficking?

- **Sex Trafficking:** Commercial sex act induced by force, fraud or coercion, or in which person performing the act is under age 18
- **Labor Trafficking:** Using force, fraud or coercion to recruit, harbor, transport, obtain or employ a person for labor or services in domestic servitude, farmworker, or factory workers.

Modern Day Slavery

- “Is the perfect storm of how poverty, chaos, destructive relationships, and the potential of opportunity will exist for those who desperately have listened and have been promised “a better life” through a job or through a relationship based on care and it is within their reach...but discover the robbing of their humanity, their soul and their control with no way out” -Kevin Bales

Indicators of trafficking

- Evidence of being controlled
- Signs of physical or sexual abuse
- Fear or depression
- Lack of documentation
- Third party insists on being present/answering questions for person
- Branding
- Loyal to trafficker

Who is at Risk?

- trait of vulnerability
- diverse ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds
- varied levels of education
- documented or undocumented
- Runaway youth
- Youth in foster care system
- Broken homes

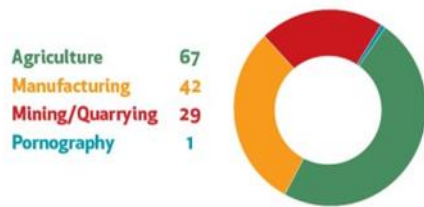
Basic Services Needed by Victims



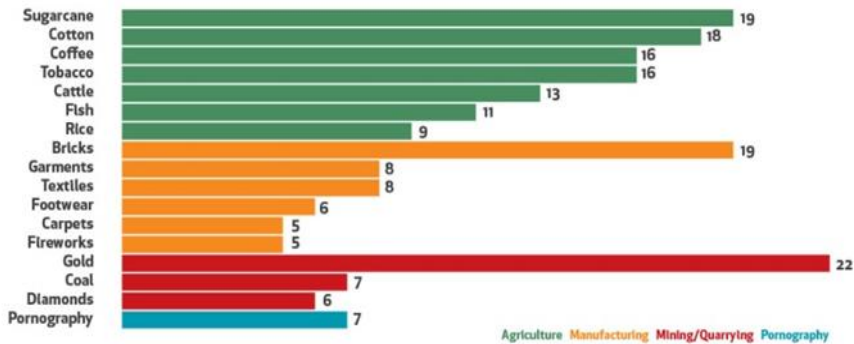

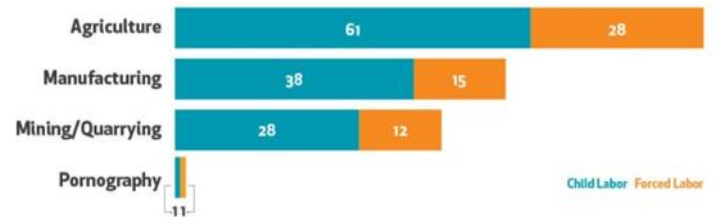
Number of Goods Produced Globally by Production Sector



Goods with Most Child Labor and Forced Labor Listings by Number of Countries and Production Sector



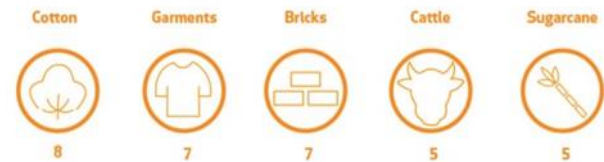
Number of Goods Produced Globally by Child Labor and Forced Labor by Production Sector

There are 45 million slaves in our world today. 1.5 million of them are in North America, and Michigan is one of the highest ranking US states. The owners of several Subway restaurants in Saginaw, Michigan, compelled to respond to human trafficking, have decided to be **business leaders in the direction of freedom**. A percentage of the profits from this restaurant will be donated to Anti-trafficking initiatives.

They understand that no one wants to eat food picked by slaves. That's why the owners have a zero tolerance for forced labor in the food that is prepared for their Subway customers to enjoy.

SOME OF THEIR EFFORTS INCLUDE:

-  Working with Subway International to ensure their supply chain is not supporting forced labor.
-  Giving a portion of profits to the Set Free Movement, which works to end slavery in the US and globally.
-  Committed to adhering to labor laws and practices to ensure workers are paid and treated fairly.
-  Eventually, this restaurant may have the capacity to hire employees who have endured trafficking.
-  Continually seeking to be an innovative model of how business can be a powerful force for good.

- Kelsey found an interesting opportunity to work at a summer camp. She's expected to work 70-80 hours a week for less than minimum wage after room and board. She's only allowed to contact her friends and family on an emergency basis or late at night on a weekend.

Trafficking

- Gina is in desperate times and needs a place to stay for the night. Her friend, Mike, offers that she can stay at his house in exchange for sex every now and again.

Trafficking

- Isaac works in a gas station for his uncle and is expected to work 16 hour days at the gas station. He sleeps in a cot in the back office and is beaten if he discusses leaving or talks to customers about his situation. He is paid minimum wage for the first 40 hours

Not Trafficking

- Jennifer decided to sleep with her new boyfriend in a closed bedroom at a college party, during which, his friends came into the room, videotaping the encounter and posting it later as free porn without her consent.
